Copies of the book will be available for purchase. Steele lives in Echo



and is on the Echo Library Board. She teaches composition classes at BMCC. Steele was born in West Virginia and grew up between Oregon and Tennessee. She received her MFA in Poetry from Spalding University, and her poetry collection Paper Bird was nominated for an Oregon Book Award in 2008. Greasewood Creek is her first novel. It is set in Eastern Oregon and has been earning great reviews: "The expressive language of poetry is unmistakable in Steele's lyrical debut novel... This is a spare but powerful novel from award-winning poet Steele. Intelligently written, the narrative offers insight into the depth of human loss and suffering." —Library Journal

"Steele offers an eloquent meditation on patterns of grief, loss, and silence between generations, with the quiet, grounded narration moving fluidly across time and slowly revealing these patterns.
