Parental Responsibility

The City Council passed a Parental Responsibility Code at their September meeting which provides for a \$250 maximum fine and imposition of restitution for: violation of the code. A citation can be issued for the "offense of failing to supervise a minor if the person is the parent, legal guardian or person with legal responsibility for the safety and welfare of a child under 18 years of age and the child violates any provision of this City Code, a state law or regulation, or a federal law or rule.
