Main Street in downtown Pendleton adjacent to the weekly Farmers Market.

In addition to the relay race event, dog owners of all breeds can enter the costume contest to win the "Best Costume," "Funniest," and "Best Owner/Dog Look-A-Like" categories. The event also includes many family fun activities including pony rides, a jump house, a dunk tank, children's carnival games, food and drinks, and raffle prizes. The top raffle prize is two free round trip travel vouchers from Seaport Airlines. In addition, copies of the classic children's book "Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs" will be given away to thirty lucky winners of a no-cost raffle at the event.
