The 4th annual Red2Red Cycle Race will be Saturday, March 3. There will be limited parking in the downtown and you can expect road delays on Main & Dupont Streets from 10am till 3pm. "The race showcases the unique Eastern Oregon desert terrain and MTB trail system... The course is 70% single track." Last year there were over 420 entries and at least that number are expected this year. The race starts on Main Street at 11 am and then goes west out of town on the Echo-Lexington Highway to the Piercy/Echo West Ranch on Snow Road.

The Echo Kiwanis will be serving a

breakfast & lunch plates Saturday for \$5 each, which is open to the public.

Sno Road Winery will be providing music and wine in the Koontz Building.




DOWNTOWN PROJECT

Echo's Downtown will undergo major changes this summer between the Downtown Enhancement Project and continuing renovation of Downtown buildings such as the Koontz Building by the Piercy's.

The Enhancement Project is scheduled to go to bid in April with construction this summer and fall. The project will widen the

Main Street Sidewalks from the Skatepark to Bonanza Street to 10 feet. Graphics depicting new garbage containers, planters, bike racks & Vintage-style street lights similar to those selected for the project are shown







to 10 feet. Rounded curb extensions on the corners will help slow traffic as well as

looking nice. A planter in each curb extension will also serve as benches. The Vintage Style Street lights will have flag holders and brackets for hanging floral baskets. The new benches, bike racks, planters & garbage receptacles will be iron. Benches will have a horse motif to match the overpass horses.

We are also hoping to add public art & are taking donations to help with this part of the project. Do you have ideas or suggestions for ideas for art projects? Donors will be honored on a plaque.

The downtown improvements also include a new sign at Thielsen & Main which will feature a life-size image of Echo Koontz (see above).

New entry signs will be installed at the North and East entries to town this spring. Artist Chris Huffman, who created the Over-



pass Horses, is creating signs that will feature one of the Echo logo designs created by Design Point Graphics several years

ago. The logo will be made from metal with a blue background (see above).

Dog Licenses

The 2011 dog licenses expired on Dec.

31 and 2012 licenses need to be renewed. Licenses not renewed by Feb. 29, 2012 will be subject to a penalty of \$10 per month for each month the licensing is delayed. Current license fees are \$4.00 per year for a spayed



or neutered animal and \$12 per year for an unaltered animal. Proof of a current rabies shot is required.
