Dog Licenses

Dog License fees increase by \$10 per month to \$14 (spayed/neutered) and \$22 (unaltered) on March 1. Licenses not purchased by April 1



will rise another \$10 and will continue to rise \$10 per month thereafter. Citations will be issued for unlicensed dogs after March 15. The penalty doesn't apply to new dogs licensed within two weeks or puppies if they are licensed by 6 months of age.
