Echo Improvements

The new Echo Entry signs designed by Hermiston Artist Chris Huffman at the Gerone Street and North Thielsen Rd. entries to town will be installed by April 19. The new Main Street Sign is completed and will be installed as soon as the Echo Koontz Painting is completed. As funds are raised, the entry signs will be added at the west end of Main Street and on Thielsen Rd. South.

A grant from the Echo Benefit fund provided funds to install Lexan panels over the windows at the Fire Equipment & Covered Wagon Display in the Fort Henrietta Park. The panels will be installed this spring.
