is to pull them, roll them up and dispose of them in a burning barrel or trash can. You can spray them, but need to do so before they set seeds and that means spraying every week as the seeds keep germinating and the new plant can set seeds within 2 to 3 weeks according to goat heads.com.

Tree Corner-Summer Tree care

Summer can be a stressful time for trees due to the heat and droughts. Make sure you watch them for signs of trouble. Selection/ **Planting:** Trees can be planted in summer as long as you are willing to water regularly. However, there is a greater chance that the transplanted tree will be damaged or die due to the heat. Try to plant in fall or spring instead if possible. Watering: You will need to watch your trees carefully, especially in times of drought. Look for leaf drop and wilting. Give your trees extra water if you see this. Remember trees need more and deeper watering than your lawn. Fertilizing: Fertilize if needed (test your soil if you notice stunted growth, discolored or dead leaves, or wilting) in early summer. You should take care with using nitrogen fertilizers in late summer - they will promote new growth which may be damaged in winter. **Pruning:** Focus more on simply removing dead, diseased or damaged branches. Many trees are more prone to diseases if pruned in late spring or summer.
