Celebrate Oregon's Culture Prizes awarded daily Oct. 1-8 for so-

cial media posts

As part of the <u>2014 Days of Culture</u>

campaign, the Oregon Cultural Trust is inviting you to post snapshots on social media Oct. 1 -8 that illustrate your cultural expe-



riences -- anything from a good meal or a concert experience to a backwoods hike or a family event. The possibilities are endless as culture is all about who we are, what we do and how we experience life!

Traditionally a weeklong celebration of events and activities presented by Oregon's

1,300 cultural organizations, coalitions and tribes, Days of Culture commemorates the Oct.8 anniversary of the Cultural Trust, established in 2001.

"Many people think culture is exclusively about art, humanities and history," said Aili Schreiner, Cultural Trust manager. "Certainly going to a concert, reading a book or visiting a monument are cultural experiences, but so is celebrating a birthday by eating cake or landing your first salmon on the Columbia River. Our culture is defined by who we are, what we do and how we experience life."

All Oregonians are invited to share their culture by capturing a photo of a cultural moment and posting it on Facebook, Twitter or Instagram with the hashtag #thisisculture. The goal is to digitally showcase a range of cultural experiences from around the state. Everyone who posts will be eligible to win a daily prize; prizes include: a Portland Trail Blazers package; a stay at The Lodge at Kah-Nee-Ta; Oregon Symphony tickets; passes to the Oregon Coast Aquarium; and lodging at the historic Balch Hotel in Dufur, Ore.

Days of Culture also launches the Trust's fundraising season; those who gave or give a 2014 donation to one of Oregon's designated 1,300 cultural nonprofits (**The Fort Henrietta Foundation, and Echo Historical Museum are on the list)** are eligible for a tax credit if they make a matching gift to the Cultural Trust.

Fill out and return the entry form below, then you or you and your group go build a scarecrow. Bring it (or the components to build it) to Echo by **9 am on Saturday the 11th**. Scarecrow Central (check-in point) is Gathered Over Time, 210 W Main. A volunteer will tell you where to put the scarecrow. It has to be completed and ready for judging by 11. It can be a sitter or a stander, but if it's a stander make sure it will stand strong (include support). It can be homemade or a Rehabbed Commercial Scarecrow. **Judging begins at 11**. Prizes will be awarded at 2 o'clock.

Cash prizes will be awarded to Peoples' Choice \$50, Best in Show \$50, Built by Kids \$25. The judges will pin ribbons on some other scarecrows of note as well.

Scarecrows must stay until 5 pm, but we would love to have as many scarecrows as possible spend the rest of October on display.
