Rabies Clinic

Country Animal Hospital will hold a rabies vaccination clinic again this year, but the date has not yet been set. A poster will be displayed at city later this month with the date and time. City Clerk Peggy Haines will send out letters to dog owners with the date and will be at the clinic to issue dog licenses for 2016.



Dog Licenses

The 2015 dog licenses expired on Dec. 31 and **2016 licenses** need to be renewed. Licenses not renewed by **Feb. 28, 2016** will be subject to a penalty of **\$10 per month** for each month the licensing is delayed. Current license fees are \$4.00 per year for a spayed or neutered animal and \$12 per year for an unaltered animal. Proof of a current rabies shot is required.
