Dog Licenses

2016 dog licenses need to be purchased by **Feb. 29** to avoid a penalty of **\$10 per month** for each month the licensing is delayed. Current license fees are \$4.00 per year for a spayed or neutered animal and \$12 per year for an unaltered animal. Proof of a current rabies shot is required.

Building Upgrades

Thanks to the Echo Community Benefit Plan the Echo Masonic Lodge's 1st floor has gone through a major transformation. Shown here are the new Kitchen cup-



boards & counter tops. Below is the new Pergo flooring and paint job. Thanks to Kevin Fife Construction for the upgrades.



The Lodge is one of the oldest buildings in Umatilla County and is on the National Register of Historic Places.

It was built c. 1863 in Umatilla Landing and was taken apart c. 1901, loaded on rail cars and transported to Echo where it was reconstructed. The upstairs has always been the lodge meeting room and the first floor was rented out to businesses in the early years. One business was a Billiards Hall where Near Beer was sold.

Old VFW Hall

The Old VFW Hall was given to the city in November and is slowly being transformed into a meeting space, the library's Amazon



book store and the library's craft area. The weekly story and craft time is being held there now on Fridays from 2 to 3:15 pm.

The building does need work to upgrade plumbing and make the kitchen functional, to upgrade floor joists and make outside improvements such as painting and water sealing. Most of these repairs will have to wait for grants and donations.



The City of Echo has a compliance agreement with Oregon Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) due to problems with our 30 plus year old wastewater system and due to increased environmental requirements for river discharge that necessitates improvements to the sewer system.

To apply for funds to finance the sewer system upgrades, the City must provide certain demographic information about the city to the State of Oregon. Portland State University (PSU) will be assisting the

The city hall building houses an extreme number of artifacts important to the community. *A new state-of-the-art facility needs to be constructed to house the materials gleaned from the area, or an existing building could be brought up to museum standards to better house and display items. The judges suggest recognizing the story of the current freight trains travelling through town.

The city newsletter is well done and is used to keep the public informed of current events, projects, and Echo's history. A "This month in Echo History" section or a "museum tid-bit" section in the newsletter may serve as a reminder of how history has shaped Echo.

The Echo Historical Museum is located in a beautiful bank building and is loaded with wonderful donations and exhibits. The museum is open on weekends and staffed by volunteers. Efforts need to be made to increase the number of volunteers so the museum continues to grow and operate. Silent movies or old westerns could be shown and the youth volunteers could serve popcorn!

Another jewel is the Chinese House/OR & N Railroad Museum. Located across from city hall, it is housed in a former Chinese laborer bunkhouse. It is bustling with tools, photos, and artifacts excavated from a railroad site. To guarantee that this history is not lost, and can be properly insured, an inventory of items on display and in storage is needed. Another option is to video the facility and then use software designed for historical archiving. The Museum Archive software project (<http://musarch.com>) provides free basic downloads to help organize museum collections. Contact the American Alliance of Museums for additional help. www.aam-us.org. Meanwhile the tools should be labelled so museum visitors can better understand what they are seeing.

Echo's red fire hydrants stand proudly on street corners. These are 'little pieces of art' waiting to happen. Engage local artists or Echo High School art class to design and paint the hydrants to tell a specific story of Echo's. A streetscape, Echo's flower the dahlia, or horses could gallop across the body of the hydrant.
