

Besides serving brews and food in the evening and providing musical entertainment, the Kiwanis are sponsoring a Bouncy House and games in the city park. Gathered Over Time, Echo Station, the City of Echo and Echo Library will host children's activities as part of the 3rd annual Scarecrows on Main, Scarecrow Contest.

Echo Ridge Cellars is the converted granary on the north edge of town. The Oktoberfest will be in the large concrete warehouse next to the Echo Ridge Tasting Room

& Event Center. Pendleton's *Rowdy Fix* Band will start playing at 6:45 pm. Two local brewers will serve beer: Hermiston Brewing and Pendleton's Prodigal



Son. A Potato Sausage, salads and homemade sauerkraut from H & P Café will be



served. Alexander's handmade chocolates will also be available at Echo Ridge.

If you run out of coupons, more will be available at \$5 each. Coupons can be used at any of the participating Echo Oktoberfest products or services. You can purchase the tickets in advance at H & P Café, Echo Ridge Cellars. Gathered Over Time. Alexander's Chocolates, Hermiston Brewing, Prodigal Hermiston Son, Chamber, Hermiston City Hall and from Echo Kiwanis members.




Proceeds will go to maintenance of St. Peter's Catholic Church. The church is on the National Register of Historic Places and was built in 1913. It is a deconsecrated Catholic Church currently owned by the Fort Henrietta Foundation.

More on St. Peter's

St. Peter's is probably the most photographed building in Echo. Visitors often ask why it hasn't been restored. The answer is lack of funding. The cost to restore the church is estimated to be over \$160,000. Needs in-

clude repair/ replacement of Stucco, restoration of decorative wood work on the building's exterior. interior water damage repair, and stucco repair. exterior step replacement, window repair, re-



moval of carpet and wooden floor refinishing.

The interior of the church still has the statuary, priests vestments, church artifacts, organs, alter and pews. Signage and placement of artifacts in cases as required by the Catholic Church have been completed. A new roof was put on it about 12 years ago.

A grant from the Kinsman Foundation provided funding for the roof and other minor repairs and about \$13,000 has been donated in the form of donations of Echo Catholics, particularly members of the Portuguese community. The balance of these



funds will be used as matching funds for other donations or grants.

The foundation has applied for funding from the Meyer Memorial Trust and three times from the Echo Community Benefit Plan without success to date.

Scarecrow Contest Information

Its time to start planning your entry for the 3rd Annual Scarecrows on Main. How about a contest that will fill the Downtown with fall fun? Yes?

Okay! Here's the scoop. Fill out and return the entry form below, then you or you and your group go build a scarecrow. Bring it or Build it on Echo's Main St. from 10 am to noon on Saturday the 22nd of October. The Scarecrow Central (check-in point) is Gathered Over Time, 210 W Main. It has to be completed and ready for judging by **NOON**. It can be a sitter or a stander, but if it's a stander make sure it will stand strong (include support). It can be homemade or a Rehabbed Commercial Scarecrow.

Ribbon will be placed by 2 p.m. Cash prizes will be awarded to Best of Show (1 adult & 1 child) of \$50 & a trophy for **Peoples' Choice plus \$25, Most Fun \$25**. The judges will also pin ribbons on some other scarecrows of note. We would love to have as many scarecrows as possible stay on display until November. We promise to do our best to look after them, but well.. we're not around 24/7 so we can't promise that they will remain perfect.

Be Creative, but nice. The idea is to scare crows not children. If you're taking your scarecrow home on Saturday, don't take it until 5. Have fun. Play nice.

Scarecrows must be picked up by November 5, 2016 or they go to Scarecrow

heaven otherwise known as the city dumpster.
