# Dog Licenses

Dog licenses for 2017 need to be purchased by Feb. 28 this year to avoid a penalty. Any license, except for those for new dogs or puppies obtained on March 1 or after will have a \$10 per month penalty added for each month the licensing is past due.

The current license fees, less any penalties, are \$4.00 per year for a spayed or neutered



animal and \$12 per year for an unaltered animal. Proof of a current rabies shot is required.

If you have added a dog or puppy, they need to be licensed within 2 weeks

of turning 6 mos. or being acquired. Let the City Clerk know it is a new dog so she can pro-rate the fee.
