The City Council has received a request to annex property located north of town between the I-84 interchange and Bowman Road. This area is in the city's Urban Growth Zone and will be zoned Tourist Commercial/

L i g h t Industrial, if ann e x e d. Possible b u s i n e s s / developm e n t will be a



motel complex, RV Park and Tourist-oriented businesses, a mushroom farm and agriculture sales/service area.

This annexation request is proposed to be discussed at the May 18 City Council meeting at 4 pm at the Old VFW Hall, 210 W. Bridge. Public Comments, oral or written, will be accepted, but oral comments may be limited to 2-3 minutes.

Dog Licenses

Dog Licenses for **2017** are now overdue and a \$10 **penalty per month per dog will be assessed** for each license obtained after Feb. 28.

If you no longer have your dog, please contact the city clerk ASAP so she can remove the animal from our records, 541-376-8411.

If you are a new resident you have two weeks to license your animal to avoid a late fee and your license will be pro-rated. If you obtain a new dog, please let the clerk know so she can pro-rate your license and doesn't charge a penalty.

The fee before penalties is \$4 for spayed or neutered dogs and \$12 for unaltered dogs. Proof of rabies and spaying must be provided.


