Council

Vacancy

Tammie Williams has been appointed to fill the vacancy left by Lou Nakapalau. Williams will serve until Dec. 31, 2018, but this position and three other council positions will be up for election in November.

Three positions will be for four years and one for 2 years. Echo council members are elected at large. People interested in running for office may pickup petitions after May 30 and they are due by August 25. The charter requires you to file a petition signed by 20 registered voters.

To run for council you must be a registered voter living within the Echo corporate limits for at least one year.

The Mayor's position is only 2 years, so this position will also be up for election.

Utility Bills

If you see a difference in the water charges on your bill this month, the rate didn't increase. You have been billed the minimum over the winter as we do not read meters from November through your March bill. We begin reading again in March and the amount billed in April will include amounts over the minimum of 3000 gallons per month for the winter usage.



Free Dump

Saturday, April 7 will be the last day you can take loads of garbage to the Sanitary

Disposal Transfer Station for cash customers in good standing. Customers will receive up to a \$14 discount on each load. This means loads measuring up to 2.5 cubic yards with a maximum weight of 454 1/2 lbs. can be disposed of free of charge. This includes all acceptable solid waste with the exception of tires, which will be charged at the regular rate. The transfer station is located 2 miles north of Hermiston on the West side of Hwy 395. It is open weekdays from 8 am to 5 pm and weekends from 9 am to 5 pm.




Arbor Day/Tree Fair
