## Council

### ELECTION

Four council and the mayor will be up for election in November.

Three positions will be for four years and one for 2 years. The mayor's position is for 2 years. Echo council members are elected at large.

Those interested in running may pickup petitions beginning May 30 and they are due by August 21. The charter requires you to file a petition signed by 20 Echo City registered voters. You cannot pay a fee at the courthouse to file. You can sign only one petition per office, i.e. one mayor petition and 4 council petitions. If someone signs 2 mayor petitions for example, the signature will only be counted on the first filed petition.

**COUNCIL MEMBERS ARE VOLUNTEERS AND ARE NOT PAID.**

To run for council you must be a registered voter living within the Echo corporate limits for at least one year prior to filing.

The Mayor's position is only 2 years. '

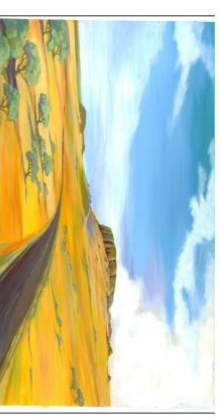
