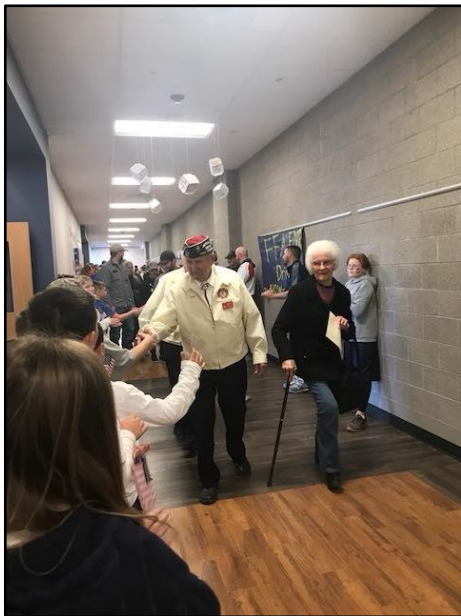

Recently, Master Gardener Kathy Hensel met with Justin Northern and Ken Hendrix, of the Echo City Public Works Department, and city volunteer Kathy Thew to discuss plans for maintaining the George Park flower garden, as well as other city plants and flowers. The ongoing project will begin with identifying existing perennials and catching up on pruning and trimming. In the spring, more plants will be re-pruned and others repositioned for better access to natural light and ease of upkeep.

Watch for further developments, such as the removal of hanging baskets and planters on Main Street for winter storage.

Public Meeting

On October 8, the **Umatilla River Trails Project** held an educational meeting at the Echo Community Room, one of four county-wide meetings made possible by a technical assistance grant from the National Park Service. County Planning Director Robert Waldher and Stephanie Stroud, of the Park Service, presented information about a proposed system that would interconnect Umatilla, Hermiston, Stanfield and Echo through a network of

recreational trails. The evening included interactive workstations where participants were invited to provide personal input and indicate preferences on routes and length of the trail.

After public input is gathered from the four involved communities, the next step will be for the cities to come together to formulate a conceptual plan and adopt it. The Echo School District recently received a \$10,000 grant from the Echo Community Benefit Plan Board to construct a mobile propane barbeque trailer for school and community use. The new trailer will alleviate the need to borrow individually-owned BBQs for events such as National Night Out, the ACE Car Show, the Echo FFA Dinner and Auction and large memorial services.

Raymon Smith, school superintendent, says that the 10-foot-long steel trailer is expected to be in use by February, 2020. Says Smith, "We truly feel that this item will be put to great use in the school and the Echo Community."
